Non-Discrimination Policy

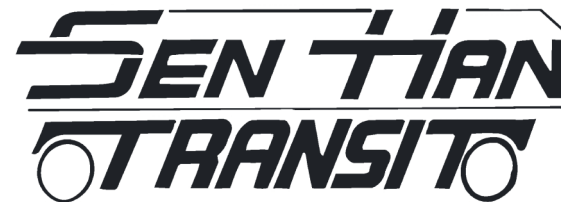

The following transportation services are available to Camden County residents 60 years of age or older and those deemed disabled by completing the SEN-HAN Disabled Application. Times available vary by type of ride.

NON-EMERGENCY MEDICAL

Door to door rides to medical appointments at a physician's office, medical facility or hospital in Camden County, border-line facilities in connecting counties and limited hours/days in center city Philadelphia. Reservations can be made two days to two weeks in advance.

SHUTTLE SERVICE

Voorhees Township

Medical facilities at Pavilions of Voorhees/Tatem Brown, Carnie Boulevard offices, Centennial Boulevard offices, Virtua Hospital, Rohrer Center for Health Fitness, Genesis Nursing Home and specific locations on Evesham and Cooper Road with three stops per day.

Philadelphia

In conjunction with Gloucester County, a shuttle goes to Cooper Hospital, Pennsylvania Hospital, Wills Eye Hospital, Jefferson Hospital, Graduate Hospital, Children's Hospital, HUP, Sheie Eye Institute and the VA Hospital Monday through Thursday and to the VA Hospital only on Friday.

SHOPPING

Shopping service is provided to 24 Camden County municipalities with routes and stops modified or changed as requests are received from riders. Call the office for current stops in your municipality. Appointments must be made the working day before your trip by calling (856) 456-1148 between 6:00 am and 5:00 pm. Intake forms will be given to passengers as they board the vehicle. Purchases limited to what you can carry or three regular size bags. Eleven municipalities provide their own shopping buses.

PERSONAL BUSINESS

Transportation for personal business such as home/hospital visits, banking, entitlement offices, social events, etc. in Camden County within five (5) miles from your home is available Monday through Friday. Call (856) 456-3344 three days in advance to schedule a ride.

CAMDEN CITY SPECIAL PROJECT

This service assists Camden City residents in accessing regional shopping centers and operates one day a week. Call (856) 456-3344 for more information.
